

Just a generation ago, it was adults, not kids, who changed genders. But today, many children are transitioning, too — with new medical options, and at younger and younger ages.


In *Growing Up Trans, Frontline* takes viewers on an intimate and eye-opening journey inside the struggles and choices facing transgender kids and their families.

The Day it Snowed in Miami

Sunday, June 24 at 10 PM

Traces the political activism behind an equalrights statute in Miami, and how it galvanized the gay rights movement in Florida and beyond. Thirty five years ago, as snowflakes prepared to dust palm trees in a city known for its warmth, Miami-Dade County lawmakers unknowingly debated an issue that would ignite a political maelstrom. The 90-minute documentary also chronicles the tragic effects of the AIDS pandemic in South Florida.

KRCB's deep roots among Sonoma County musicians and its service to this community for many decades made us a trustworthy partner.

The grants have now been distributed. All recipients had to flee their homes without time to pack their instruments and other gear. Proceeds from the grants were used to replace instruments and recording equipment and, in some cases, assisted professional musicians in getting back on the road and performing again.

We have appreciated this opportunity to be of service and thank the donors for their demonstration of compassion.

Great Performances: Driving Miss Daisy

Wednesday, June 20 at 8 PM

Alfred Uhry's Pulitzer Prize-winning play *Driving Miss Daisy* comes to television with five-time Tony Award-winner Angela Lansbury and two-time Tony Award-winner James Earl Jones as Daisy Werthan and Hoke Colburn, respectively. Boyd Gaines (a four-time Tony Award winner) reprises his Broadway role as Boolie Werthan.

Uhry's classic play is a timeless, searing, funny, and ultimately hopeful meditation on race relations in America, told through the complex relationship between two of popular culture's most enduring characters.



Karamu: 100 Years in the House

Wednesday, June 20 at 9:30 PM

The word "Karamu" comes from a Swahili word meaning "a place of joyful gatherings." For the past 100 years, the Karamu House in Cleveland, Ohio – the oldest African-American theater in the United States – has lived up to its name, serving as a community center for the arts and maintaining a legacy of innovation and diversity. *Karamu: 100 Years In The House* tells the story behind this important theater in America's arts and culture history. Karamu House has come to be known as a respected training ground and launching pad for many nationally known actors, playwrights and artists, including poet and playwright Langston Hughes, and author, folklorist, and anthropologist Zora Neale Hurston.



Great Performances: Indecent

Wednesday, June 27 at 8 PM

Written by Pulitzer Prize-winner Paula Vogel, *Indecent* is about the love and passion to create theatre, even in the most difficult of circumstances. The play follows a troupe of actors, the cast of Sholem Asch's *God of Vengeance*, who risked their lives and careers against enormous challenges to perform a work in which they deeply believed, at a time when art, freedom and truth were on trial. It is a story told with compassion and honesty, but also with great theatricality, and joyous songs and dances. This recording of *Indecent* was completed just prior to its final Broadway performance.


