The Campbell Foundation has awarded Northern California Public Media (NorCal Public Media) a significant grant for its ongoing climate work. With the award of a \$15,000 grant, The Campbell Foundation builds on their commitment to the health of the environment and sustains NorCal Public Media's Center for Environmental Reporting: local and global climate news, emergency alerts, podcasts, film and digital shorts, investigative journalism, and stories that engage viewers and listeners across the Bay Area.

NorCal Public Media remains a trusted, independent voice that shares diverse human stories, reports on vital issues, and brings people together to strengthen community. In 2025, the organization remained on target to meet the operational goals set by its 5-year strategic plan. NorCal Public Media's *Climate California* series won an Emmy Award in June 2025 and will be released nationally by PBS in January 2026, raising the visibility of the *Center for Environmental Reporting* and growing the television and streaming audiences and the social media subscribers now sharing climate stories across four social media accounts.

NorCal Public Media's work is widely recognized for impact, particularly its contributions to environmental reporting, covering human-climate issues and showcasing community-led solutions.
